Hello everybody,

I write today, the first day of spring. It is finally here. Down on the farm our animal friends are enjoying the longer days and warming sun. I see them laying the sunshine chewing their cuds and smiling if they could. Of course, there is still two feet of snow under them but it is melting away. Our mule, Josie covers me with her white hairs every time I go near her. She knows it is time to starts ridding herself of that winter coat. The rooster crows louder and more often. And we can actually open gates more easily as the ice recedes.

Easter is just around the corner now. I wonder how many of will be up at sunrise to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus. How many of us will sing "Christ, the Lord is risen today..." We will gather with family and friends for Easter dinner and maybe Easter egg hunts. How will Easter change our lives this year?

The words, ten verses, to this favorite Easter were written by Charles Wesley (1707-1788). Charles experiences a conversion by faith in Jesus Christ in 1738. He became an English leader of the Methodist movement, most widely known for writing more than 6,000 hymns. Of course, over the years, the words have been altered to fit more modern language but the meaning is the same.

I remember as a child listening to the congregation sing this hymn on Easter. For me this hymn speaks of our faith in our risen Lord Jesus. I am touch deeply within as we sing this year after year. I hope it speaks to you also.


Christ, the Lord, is risen today, Alleluia! Sons of men and angels say, Alleluia! Raise your joys and triumphs high, Alleluia! Sing, ye heavens, and earth, reply, Alleluia!

Lives again our glorious King, Alleluia! Where, O death, is now thy sting? Alleluia! Once He died our souls to save, Alleluia! Where thy victory, O grave? Alleluia!

Love's redeeming work is done, Alleluia! Fought the fight, the battle won, Alleluia! Lo! the Sun's eclipse is over, Alleluia! Lo! He sets in blood no more, Alleluia! Soar we now where Christ hath led, Alleluia!

Following our exalted Head, Alleluia! Made like Him, like Him we rise, Alleluia! Ours the cross, the grave, the skies, Alleluia!

Hail, the Lord of earth and heaven, Alleluia! Praise to Thee by both be given, Alleluia! Thee we greet triumphant now, Alleluia! Hail, the resurrection day, Alleluia!

1 (16-28 oz) bottle of liquid disinfectant dish soap 2 pr. non-surgical latex gloves


1 (50oz) or 2 (25oz) bottles of liquid laundry detergent
