Dear friends,

Halloween paraphernalia have filled the department and hardware store shelves for weeks now. (Actually, I recall seeing a 7-foot skeleton and zombie in Lowes in early August!) Many people do not care for Halloween. Its theme of scary things: witches and zombies, Dracula's and demons. And to be sure there are those who will take advantage of the night to misbehave (to put it mildly!) Probably those who dislike Halloween the most are teachers. They have to deal with sugar high students for the next week! Others see no harm in having a little fun. Decorating the lawn, dressing up and enjoying a party. It is as much of a festival of fall as anything.

As many of you know Halloween originated with the ancient Celtic festival of Samhain, (pronounced *sow win*). People would light bonfires and wear costumes to ward off ghosts. In the eighth century, Pope Gregory III designated November 1 as a time to honor all saints. Soon, All Saints Day incorporated some of the traditions of Samhain. The evening before became known as All Hallows Eve, and later Halloween.

Every year I like to celebrate All Saints Day on the first Sunday in November. It is a day when we remember the "saints" of our church and in our lives. As a protestant church we do not have canonized saints but rather we follow the use of the word in the New Testament where when the word saint(s) is used it refers to living followers of Jesus.

During our service we read the names of our departed "saints", light a candle for each one and ring a handbell. Last year we remembered 22 of our beloved ones who have made the journey from mortal to abundant life. These included not only members of our congregation but also family members and community members. These are persons
