Dear friends,

Ecclesiastes 3:1 reminds us:

"For everything there is a season, a time for every activity under heaven."

March is an interesting month, a month of contrasts. It can be a gray, somewhat depressing month. The next day can be sunny and feel more like spring. There is mud season and there is spring skiing.
